Sir:

You are hereby appointed Chinese Inspector in the Immigration Service of this Department with compensation at the rate of five dollars per diem, when employed at your official station, payable from the appropriation "Enforcement of the Chinese Exclusion Act."

When you are absent from your station engaged upon official business assigned you by competent authority, an additional compensation of three and fifty one-hundredths dollars per diem in lieu of subsistence, together with your actual and necessary traveling expenses exclusive of subsistence, will be paid from the appropriation against which legally chargeable.

You are also designated to act as Immigrant Inspector, without additional compensation.

This appointment will take effect on date of new oath. or as soon thereafter as you enter on duty at your official station.

Payment of the compensation authorized in this appointment is subject to taking the oath of office.

(By change from \$7 per diem which included personal expenses and feed for horses during travel on official business.)
