The Honorable,

The Secretary of Commerce and Labor.

Sir:

As a result of careful consideration as to the amount of additional compensation which should be allowed mounted inspectors along the Mexican border district, the Bureau is of opinion that the amount should be fixed at \$2.50 per diem in lieu of \$3.00. These officers are engaged almost exclusively on scouting work and are sent to points in ^{the} immediate vicinity of their official station, and in many instances lead more or less of a camp life, under which conditions their expenses will be considerably less than those of the first grade inspectors.

I therefore have the honor to recommend that the appointments of the following-named mounted inspectors be amended so as to provide for additional compensation of \$2.50 per diem in lieu of \$3.00, together with actual and necessary traveling expenses exclusive of subsistence.
