WHEREAS, There appeared in the columns of the Nogales Daily Herald a letter written by Jas. S. McCann, of New York City, a visitor in this City, expressing his appreciation of exceptional courtesy of Customs and Immigration men in handling the traffic across the International line at this Port, mentioning particularly Eugene I. Siddell of the Immigration Service and Hugh Benton of the Customs Service, and

WHEREAS, Mr. McCann stated in this letter that he had crossed the line at nearly every port in the United States but that he had never before received the courtesy that was extended to him at the port of Nogales; that he again was proud that he was a taxpayer of this country, a feeling he claimed he did not have when visiting other ports and coming in contact with government employees; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Nogales are proud of the name of their city, the "Friendly City on the Border" and in all lines of endeavor try to make good on this slogan and particularly are we happy when public notice is taken of government employees who, grasping the spirit of this city, endeavor to carry out their duties efficiently yet with courtesy to all, rich or poor, citizen or alien.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of Directors of the Nogales Chamber of Commerce, in session this 4th day of March, 1926, that there be expressed to Eugene I. Siddell and Hugh Benton the appreciation of this Chamber of Commerce for uniform courtesy on the International line, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be published in the local newspapers, and that copies be sent to Mr. Siddell and Mr. Benton and to the Immigration Department and Customs Department officials.
