

Under date of the 5th ultimo, file No. 8002, Supervisor of Border Patrol George J. Harris addressed the Bureau in answer to its letter of July 22nd last, No. 55423/660-B, recommending the adoption of a 12 ounce all worsted gabardine, known as No. 857, supplied by H. W. & I. Schwap, jobbers and Uniform Specialists of New York City, for summer uniforms for patrol inspectors and setting forth in detail the desirability of this cloth over the cotton khaki. In this connection there is enclosed herewith copy of self-explanatory letter addressed to this office under date of the 24th instant by the Chief Patrol Inspector at El Paso, Texas, relative to this matter.

This office also believes that the gabardine mentioned is more suitable for use in this district and respectfully recommends that it be authorized to direct that this material be used in the summer uniforms of patrol inspectors in this district.
