Gentlemen:

In response to your letter of the 14th instant, you are advised that the Customs House Service is under the Treasury Department, and your application for a set of regulations covering uniforms worn by men in the Customs Service should be filed with the Commissioner of Customs, Treasury Department, Washington, D. C.

Inclosed is a copy of the specifications covering uniforms for Patrol Inspectors and Immigrant Inspectors; also copies of amendments that have been made to the original specifications. It is now proposed to make a further change in the specifications for these uniforms, as indicated below:

SUMMER AND WINTER UNIFORM - PATROL INSPECTOR

Facings: Blue Cloth, 220 Warrenton.

Sleeves: To be fitted with cuff on top sleeve only, cuff pointed in center 6 inches deep and 4 inches deep on seams, bottom edge of cuff turned in even with bottom edge of sleeve.

Shoulder Straps: To be of same material as cuff and to extend to edge of collar and be fastened with button and buttonhole.

SUMMER AND WINTER UNIFORM - IMMIGRANT INSPECTOR

Shoulder Straps: Coat to have shoulder straps let into the sleeve and shoulder seams and to be finished $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide at the base and tapering to $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches at the upper end, including piping, and to extend to edge of collar and be fastened with button and buttonhole. The edges to be piped with $1/8$ inch navy blue cloth. The straps to be of the same material as the coat and lined on the underside with the same material.
