## Commissioner Coneral of Imaigration, Washington, D. C.

In order that ranking officers may be more readily distinguished among Border Patrol Inspectors. I respectfully submit herewith, for your consideration, recommendations for certain changes in the ornments worn on the prescribed uniforms:

1. Ornements for Assistant Superintendent to remain as at present and, in addition, authorize two bars of gold braid, each three ( 3 ) inches in length by three eights $\left(3 / 8^{m}\right)$ of en inch in width, to be worn on the blue triming of the uniform left blouse sleevo. The upper strip to be placed so that the dads join the edges of the blue cuff, thereby forming an inverted triangle. The lower strip to be placed three eights $\left(3 / 8^{\prime \prime}\right)$ of an inch below, and parallel to the first strip.
2. Ornaments of Chief Patrol Inspectors to rema in as at present. In addition, eathorive one strip of fold braid same as described in Dar. I above, to be placed as indicated for upper strip in Par. 1.
3. Ormanents of Senior Patrol Inspectors to remain as at present. In addition, authorize one strip of silver braid of size described in Par. 1 above, and placed as indicated in Par. 2.

41 Discontinue the use of the shoulder ornaments by regalar Patrol Inspectors.
5. Discontimue use of braid on sleeves of overcoats worn by regular Patrol Inspectors.
6. Authorise same braid design as now in use for ranking officers, as follows:
(a) Assistant Superintendent: Design formed of three ( 3 ) rows of black silk braid.
(b) Chief Patrol Inspectors: Design formed of two (2) rows of black silk braid.
(c) Senior Patrol Inspectors: Deriga formed of one (1) row of black silk braid.

In the writer's opinion, the changes sugsested would permit of readily identifying the variow raniting officery in thout the necessity of questioning at inoppertione times.
