Now are edvised that on June 9th at about 5 p. m. the writer, in company with Patrol inspectors Irvin H. Come and Herbert C. Phelan, mounted on horses, left their camp at Peles. N. H. for the purpose of westing in the campen from boundry line near monument No. 2 to MI Pass brick plant in New Mexico. The purpose was guarding the Border aguinst illegal entry of aliens and contraband that might pass in that vacinity.

We left our horses tied in the mountains near nomment No. 2 and proceeded on foot to trail near brick plant, the place we intended to work. Just as we serived, about dark, in the vicinity where Patrol Inspector Thad Pippin was killed and Senior Patrol Ins octor Crossett wounded, we set two men with back burro londed with apparently a heavy load. The two energi ore upon seeing us opened fire with what the writer judged to be pintels. Their fire was returned and one of the saugglars use believed to have been hit. as upon cutting sign near some of shooting on the morning of the 10th inst. a trail of blood was found landing toward nominent Ho. 1. where the samplers no doubt orossed back into Mexico. examination, the burre was found to have been hit twice in hips. and the lead of liquor upon his back was found to contain two 40 gallon came of alcohol, two 44 gallon came of sotol and twenty-four pints of tequila. The burro was turned loose in the vacinity of the M rase Brick Commany, as it did not seem to se of any value. liquor mentioned was turned in at Barder Patrol Resignarters. all, about thirty shots were fired.
