Reference being had to your files Nos. 5005/1635 and 5005/1987, there is transmitted herewith, in sextuplicate, statements of Patrol Inspectors Harrison C. Fugh and W. A. Holt, in reference to a gun battle with liquor saugglers at the foot of Park Street, this City, on the 26th instant. It will be noted from the reading of the statements before mentioned, that the Patrol Inspectors were fired upon first, by the saugglors in the river, whom they tried to have surrender; and again by the men on the Mexican side of the river. Also, that the Patrol Inspectors in question returned the fire of the men in the river, but not that of the men on the other side of the river. In view of the circumstances as presented, and basing his opinion on the general actions of smagglers of liquor in this vicinity, the writer is of the opinion that Patrol Inspectors Pugh and Holt were justified in returning the fire of the smusselers in the river. On the night of July 26, 1927, Patrol Inspector We A. Holt and the writer were assigned to dutyat the district known as the foot of Park Street. Position was taken at the Stanton Street International Bridge to watch the river in the vicinity of Park Street. This bridge is about 700 yeards from the foot of Park Street. This position was taken for the reason that the smuggler's movements, on the Mexican side of the river could be watched without having the officer's whereabouts discovered. At about 7:35 pm., two men were seen entering the river from the Mexican side. They seemed to be carrying a load of liquor on their backs. A run was made on foot to where, in the officer's opinion, the smagglers would emerge from the river. The saugulers caught sight of the writer and his companion before completing the journey across the river. The writer called, "Halt, we are Federal Officers". At this, the leads of liquor were dropped from the shoulders of the smugglers, and one of them opened fire upon the efficers, firing I shot from a pistol. Then the other man fired two shots. Patrol Inspector Holt fired 4 shots from his shotgun, and the writer fired one shot from his pistol. While this shooting was going on, some men from the other side of the river, opened fire upon the officers with what seemed to be pistols, firing altogether, 3 shots.

The fire from the men in the river was returned, but not that from the men on the Mexican side of the river.

An exhaustive search was made in that vicinity for some liquor that might have been dropped, and then floated to the shore, but none was found. It is believed that no one was hit.

On the night of July 26, 1927, Patrol Inspector Harrison C. Push and the writer were assigned to duty at the district on the Rio Grande River known as Park Street. Both of the Patrol Inspectors above mentioned were watching that territory from the Stanton Street International Bridge. At about 7:35 pm, two men were seen entering the river from the Mexican side, carrying what seemed to be a load of liquor. A run was made along the river bank from the bridge, towards the place where, it was thought, that they would emerge from the river. The saugulers perceived the officers raning towards them, and started back across the river, still carrying their loads. At this tie. Patrol Inspector Pugh called out "Halt, we are Federal Officers", in Spanish. A load of liquor was heard dropped in the river, and immediately a shot was fired from one of the men in the river. Then the other man fired, from what seemed to be a pistol. This fire was returned. It is not known whether any of the sougglers were hit.

firing broke out from across the river, on the Mexican side. This was not returned because there was enough to keep the Inspectors busy return ing the fire from the men in the river.

A search was made for any liquor that might have been dropped by the smugglers, but it was in vain. It is believed by the writer that the smugglers made good their escaped together with the liquor that they were carrying, into Mexico.
