There are attached hereto, each in triplicate, copies of letters addressed by the E. SCHWARZ CO., 4-6 Washington Place, N. Y. to the UNION CLOTHING CO., this City, and by the UNION CLOTHING COMPANY to this office. It will be noted from the reading of the letters herewith that a uniform shirt of certain material and make has apparently been approved by the Bureau. No official advises relative to this shirt have been received by this office, nor has confirmation been received of the statement made by E. SCHWARZ CO. in their letter of the 13th ultimo to the UNION CLOTHING COMPANY, this City (dealers in shirt mentioned), that any particular shirt has been approved by the Bureau.

Until advices are received officially the writer will, of course, be unable to advise the Patrol Inspectors in this Sub-District that any certain shirt is authorized. Instructions contained in SECOND SUPPLEMENT AND AMENDMENT TO GENERAL ORDER NO. 42, dated December 11, 1924, issued under date of June 25, 1926 provides that shirts of the same color as the uniform may be worn during summer months in lieu of uniform coat.

It might be stated that the sample shirt furnished by E. SCHWARZ CO. to the UNION CLOTHING CO., of this City, does not meet the requirements of our uniform regulations above quoted, as regards shirts to be worn by Patrol Inspectors, in that it is not of the same shade of color as the uniform.
