On October 16, 1926, the Bureau advised E. Schwarz Company that a sample shirt submitted by them was satisfactory for the use of patrol inspectors, and that there was no objection to our officers purchasing same if they desired to do so. No particular style of cloth has been adopted, and it is optional with the officers whether they wear serge, flannel, or other material, so long as the color of the shirt matches the uniform.
