I beg to acknowledge, with thanks, receipt of Bureau letter No. 55493/1 of May 3rd. Paragraph two thereof sets at rest any misunderstanding about the construction to be placed upon the expression in General Order No. 61 "other law enforcement agencies". As will be seen by my letter of May 3rd Assistant Superintendent Bonazzi understood from Assistant Secretary White that receipts are not needed and should not be taken from immigrant inspectors. Instructions in conformity with the Bureau's letter are being sent out today.

The establishment of another patrol unit at Van Buren is impossible until we can have an additional automobile for that sub-district and at least two additional patrol inspectors. None of the other units in that sub-district are strong enough to permit any transfers from them and there would be no general advantage in robbing some other sub-district in order to strengthen No. 1.

Repairs will be made to the cars in that sub-district.

There is only one vacancy among the patrol inspectors and this is in process of being filled.
