You are respectfully advised that while Patrol Inspector" Schung Richard 4. Bush and mysolf were working at Park Street, this city, even date at about SidB 4. H., we now two men coming scross the river from the Mexican side to the American side. they aroused about two hundred yords West of Park Street. We came out of our position to apprehend them and over the top of the laves at about where we thoughtwo had seen them and as we came up over the levee we new the men and colled to them to halt, stating that we were Medaral Officers, inmediately they opened fire on us and we returned their fire. About the same time six other manufers who were hid behind the river back also opened fire on us, we obsyged them, returning their fire and they rotreated crossing the river back to Mexico, at which time other riflemon on the Mexicun side of the river poured a volley of shots around us. Approximately one-hundred shots were fired in all.

You are further mivised that the liquor consisted of 27 gallons of Alechel, 12 pints of Aleshel, 312 gallons of Sotel, 29 pints of Setel. 159 gallons of Beacel, 15 pints of Toquille, 5 quarts of Cogues, 68 pints of Straight American Whiskey and 24 one-half pints of Straight American Whiskey. The above mentioned liquor was conveyed to Marder Patrol Mendquarters and placed in storeroom.

It is not known at this time whother any of the munaclars were mmand or note
