

Chief Patrol Inspector, El Paso, Texas.

You are respectfully advised that about 11 A. M. November 30, 1928, the writer was going up the levee near 9th street this city when two men were seen coming out of the river with loads on their backs. At the time I was about two hundred yards away, the men threw their loads down and ran back to the Mexican side, at the same time a man opened fire from the Mexican side and I answered with a pistol. There were about twenty shots fired in all. It is thought that no one was injured.

The above mentioned loads were conveyed to Border Patrol Headquarters and found to be about twenty four gallons of assorted liquors.

You are further advised that the writer was on annual leave at this time.
