U. S. Immigration Service,

The following instructions, issued by the Inspector in Charge at Nogales, Arizona, under date of October 26, 1928, are repeated for the information and guidance of all inspection officers of this Immigration district:

"Officers and employees serving on the International Boundary line must positively refrain from reading newspapers, magazines or other matter not of an official nature while on duty. Official lookcut notices may be read, but no effort should be made to read lengthy letters of instructions or the Immigration law while on duty, as to do so would distract the attention of the officer or employee from line duty. Such officers and employees while serving on the line must refrain from entertaining their friends or other persons in the garitas by relating stories cr jokes to such persons or by allowing their time to be taken up in listening to jokes and stories of friends or others.

"Immigration officers and employees are directed to refrain from taking magazines, newspapers, books, et cetera to the garitas."

Any violation of the foregoing instructions will result in disciplinary action.
