As a result of my survey of Border Patrol conditions thruout District No. 1, Headquarters, Montreal, the following recommendations requiring Bureau approval are respectfully submitted herewith for your consideration.

a. Authorize replacement of the following motor vehicles. At Massena, N.Y., four Chevrolet 4 cyl. sedans. At House's Point, N.Y., three Chevrolet 4 cyl. sedans, and one Ford sedan. At Newport, Vt., two Chevrolet 4 cyl. sedans. At Houlton, Me., one 4 cyl. Chevrolet sedan.

These vehicles have <sup>at</sup> attained a mileage of from 37,000 to 60,000 miles and it will be in the interest of economy to turn them in on new equipment.

b. In making these replacements it is recommended that one light truck properly equipped be furnished House's Point in lieu of a sedan.

c. It is recommended that an additional light truck be authorized for Houlton, Me.

The necessity of reaching isolated points in the woods and in checking employees in the potatoe fields in in the Maine sub-district influences the next preceding recommendation.

d. It is recommended that special effort be made to fill the vacancies now existing in sub-dist. No. 1, Houlton, Me., and sub-dist. No. 3, House's Point, N.Y.
