Referring to Bureau letter of May 1, 1931, file No. 55751/676, I desire to report that Patrol Inspectors Edwin M. Redmond, Frank Hornyak, and Robert F. Johnson competed in the try-out match for the Florida National Guard Rifle Team that is to be sent to Camp Perry, Ohio, to the national match.

Patrol Inspector Hornyak made the mark of 496 points out of a possible 550, and was second in the match. Patrol Inspector Redmond made 490 points out of a possible 550, and was fifth place. Both of these officers have been selected as members of the Florida National Guard Rifle Team. Patrol Inspector Johnson made a mark of 475 and was not selected for the team.

The firing during this match included rapid and slow fire at 200 yards, rapid fire at 300 yards, and slow fire at 600 yards.

The U. S. Immigration Border Patrol Service in District No. 10 is very much gratified at this showing.
