For your information and file, please be advised that a competitive record target shoot between teams selected from each of our subdistricts, was held at Rouses Point, N. Y., December 5.

Each team consisted of three patrol inspectors, selected as high scorers in their respective subdistrict. Regulation. 45 calibre, double action revolvers were used. Firing was done at a regulation U.S. Army target, "Target L", at the following distances; 5 rounds at 25 yards, slow fire; 5 rounds at 15 yards, rapid fire, 15 seconds per score; 5 rounds at 25 yards, rapid fire, 20 seconds per score. Possible points 150.

The following is the score by teams;
Rouses Point team (High) average 123 1/3 points.
Massena team (Second) average 119 points.
Newport team (Third) average 111 points.

I might add that owing to the severe cold wind that day, all the contestants shot an average considerably below their usual as shown by records of their prior subdistrict meets.
