GENERAL ORDER NO. 184

(Canadian Border District)

In order to coordinate the activities of the Border Patrol along the Canadian Border and secure flexibility, uniformity and despatch of operation, all officers and employees of the Border Patrol in the area referred to will, effective January 16, 1932, or as soon thereafter as the necessary arrangements are perfected, function as a unit under the direction and control of the Director of Border Patrol with headquarters at Detroit, Michigan.

The area referred to in the preceding paragraph will, for border patrol purposes, be treated as one district and be known as the Canadian Border District.

The Director of Border Patrol will adopt such measures and, from time to time, issue such instructions as are necessary and lawful properly to carry this order into effect and all heads of immigration districts in the area concerned will, to that end, extend to him such cooperation as he may require, continuing after the effective date of this order, however, to administer Border Patrol affairs as at present (including rendition of pay rolls and settlement of vouchers, etc.), until relieved of the necessity of so doing by the Director.

All orders and instructions heretofore issued inconsistent herewith are hereby rescinded.
