I note with great satisfaction the appointment of PETER E. JEFFRIES as patrol inspector at Newport, where there is only one vacancy, that created by the resignation of Joseph E. Soblosky. From this appointment I infer that the Bureau has resumed filling vacancies in the Patrol Service and I hasten to call attention to the fact that there are six vacancies in the Massena subdistrict and three in the Bonaventure Point subdistrict. These should be filled as soon as possible in order that the new appointees may be better trained before the roads open in March or April. As a matter of fact, the roads are open now and there is practically no snow on the ground. The St. Lawrence River is open and opportunities for illegal entry are as good as they are in the summer with the exception of the hazard of traveling in low temperatures.
