This office takes this opportunity of informing the Bureau that at a State Small Bore Rifle and Pistol Tournament held in St. Petersburg, Florida, February 20th and 21st, a team of four men, consisting of Patrol Inspectors Edwin M. Redmond, Frank Hornyak, Carl A. Clyatt and William J. Davis, with Robert B. Johnson as alternate and team captain, were entered to represent the U. S. Immigration Border Patrol Service in this District. Patrol Inspector Edwin M. Redmond was also entered in the individual State Pistol Championship event to represent this District. I am delighted to inform the Bureau that the four man team mentioned, shooting against peace officer teams in a State wide contest, won first place taking off a handsome silver cup trophy as team prize. Patrol Inspector Edwin M. Redmond won first prize in this same event for individual high score, for which he was awarded a handsome gold medal, and Patrol Inspector Frank Hornyak won third place for which he was awarded a bronze medal.

I am pleased to state further that Patrol Inspector Edwin M. Redmond also won second place in the State Pistol Championship, mentioned above, as well as winning second place in the Individual Free Pistol Championship, being awarded a handsome silver medal in each of these events. Patrol Inspector Redmond was also awarded another very handsome gold medal for having made the highest individual general average score in the pistol matches during the tournament.

This office is especially proud of the record our officers made at this tournament as two of the medals won were offered by the National Rifle Association of America.

I felt the Bureau would be interested in having this information, and if desired as soon as the official scores are received at this office they will be furnished to the Bureau.
