District Directors, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Galveston, Texas El Paso, Texas Los Angeles, Calif.

Patrol inspectors in your district are hereby given the option of wearing for rough service the uniform described below:

MATURIAL: Moleskin cloth - 10 Oz., forestry green (winter wear); khaki (summer wear).

STYLE:

<u>Blouse</u>: Single breasted sack (Cossack style); four button front; lapel shaped convertible collar (corduroy trimmed to match in color); two lower front patch pockets approximately 6" wife by 7" deep, semi-pointed flaps with button through the flaps; two button adjustable cuffs; length, approximately three inches below hip bone; no raw edges to show in seams; blouæ to be close-fitting at the waist in order not to interfere with side-arms.

<u>Trousers</u>: Four button fly front, one button on waist band; separate waist band with open bick (Brown system); extra heavy drill pocketing; two front pockets, one watch pocket, two hip pockets with button through on left hip pocket; eight belt loops; 20" bottoms finished without cuffs.

<u>Insignia</u>: Badge to be worn on left side of jacket, bottom of badge to be three inches above center of top of pocket flap; collar ornaments to be worn on upper points of lapel split, $\frac{1}{2}^{n}$ from front and rear edges. Regulation Border Patrol Blouse buttons to be worn on two front blouse pocket flaps."

It is not obligatory that patrol inspectors furnish themselves with this rough duty uniform. However, those officers who do supply themselves with this uniform should be permitted to wear it only under such regulations as may be prescribed by their superior officers.
