
The undersigned has given considerable thought to the subject and submits herewith an "Outline of course of instruction for student patrol inspectors covering a three-months period". Also, there is submitted a "Progressive daily schedule of instructions" covering two semi-monthly periods.

The course outlined contemplates that periods succeeding the first two will cover the same subjects in advanced form.

It is believed that competent lecturers and practical instructors who are capable of furnishing the necessary instruction in the subjects outlined are available within the Service in this district.

The five-hour daily assignments provided in the daily schedule not only permits practical patrol instruction but also provides added man power to the patrol force in the Detroit area.
