Re - Border Patrol Uniforms.


At the request of several Patrol Inspectors, particularly those who are engaged on boat details and on freight car inspections, there is attached a photograph of what might be termed a "fatigue uniform", to be used on freight car inspections, boat details, and at the pistol ranges during practice, in order to save wear and tear on the regular uniform.

The cost of this uniform would be \$5.00, which represents quite a saving over that of the regular uniform.

The uniform is of a forestry green, washable cloth, referred to as "chino" (phonetic spelling). A sample of the cloth is also enclosed.
