MEMORANDUM FOR MR. T. D. QUINN
ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT TO THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

The appointment of fifteen guards at Fort Missoula, Montana, and of twelve at Fort Lincoln, Bismarck, North Dakota, for the guarding of detained alien seamen has been authorized and a majority of them are not on duty. These men do not need identification cards but should be furnished with guard badges. The nature of their duties is such that some visible evidence of their official position is necessary, and as they have not yet been uniformed, a badge would be the only evidence at present available.

It is requested that if possible, twenty-seven guard badges be furnished for transmittal to Fort Missoula and Fort Lincoln, fifteen to be charged to Nick D. Collaer, Supervisor of Alien Detentions at Fort Missoula and twelve to Chief Patrol Inspector A. S. Hudson at Fort Lincoln, North Dakota.

As soon as these badges are issued, your office will be advised promptly as to the number of the badge issued to each guard.
