Border Patrol Intelligence; Responsibilities, Organization
Functions; Central Office Memorandum of February 4, 1955

Attention: Regional Intelligence Officer

The February 4 instruction requires that the Regional Intelligence Officer furnish the Central Office with a monthly "report on the current overall alien situation in the region, as well as his estimate of expected illegal alien activity". The Southwest Region according to existing instructions is submitting an intelligence report on a biweekly basis; the Northwest and Northeast Regions are submitting intelligence reports each month.

This memorandum will eliminate the first sentence in the first complete paragraph of page 2 of the February 4 instructions. It is desired that separate intelligence reports, identified as such, be prepared. For the time being the Southwest Regional Intelligence Officer will continue to forward a report each 15 days. The Northwest and Northeast Regional Intelligence Officers and the District Intelligence Officer at Miami, Florida, will forward an intelligence report at the end of each month.

For the purpose of keeping the Central Office informed as to the effectiveness and progress of the intelligence program, it is requested that these ~~monthly~~ reports from all regions reflect the following information:

1. Number of intelligence items furnished to Service offices outside the originating Border Patrol sector.
2. Number of intelligence items received from Service offices outside the Border Patrol sector.
3. Results -- number of aliens, smugglers or other violators apprehended as a result of Border Patrol intelligence.
